

If you think your septic system may be having a problem, check for these symptoms:

- Your toilet is gurgling;
- Water is backing up into your drains;
- Your sinks and toilets drain slowly;
- There are damp spots in your yard during dry weather;
- Areas of your yard have lush grass; or
- You smell sewage.

The Reedy River Water Quality Group is administering a 319 Cost Share Assistance Program within the boundaries of the Huff Creek watershed to assist home and business owners to repair or replace failing septic systems.

If you have a failing septic system and at your home or business in the program area, we will work with you to determine if you are eligible and how much funding you can receive.

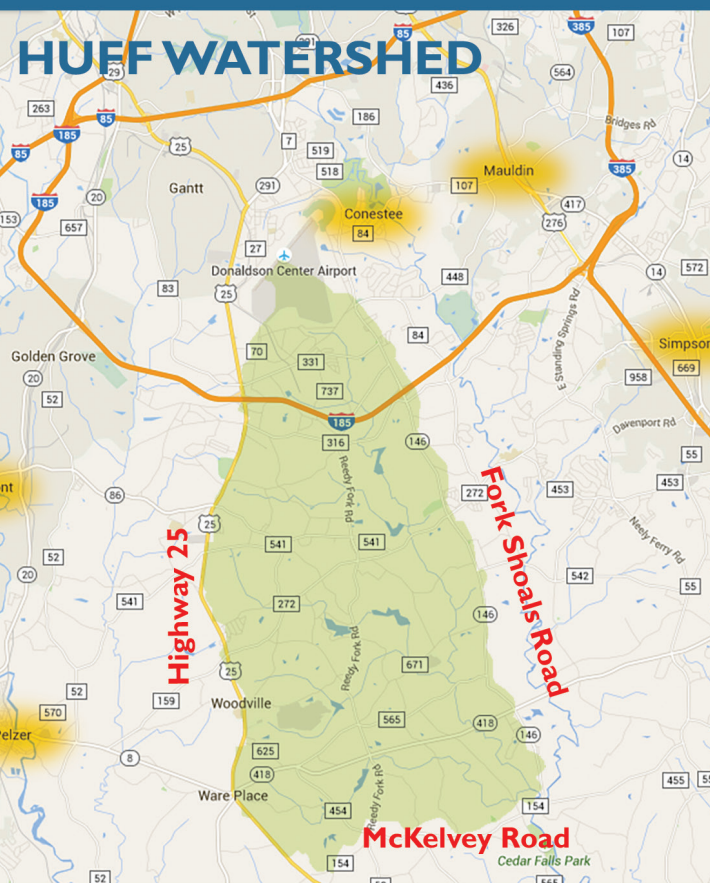

WHAT IS THE 319 PROGRAM?

The Reedy River Water Quality Group has been awarded a Section 319 Grant to address septic system problems in the Huff Creek watershed.

This two-year project will be funded by the US EPA through the SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (SC DHEC). The funds will address failing septic systems at homes and businesses to reduce the amount of bacteria and nutrients entering local waters. Failing septic systems have been identified as a key pollution source in the Huff Creek area.

The EPA and SC DHEC have realized the negative impact of septic system failures and have therefore offered grants to assist with these repairs and other pollution sources. One of our top water quality concerns in Greenville County is bacteria. This program allows Greenville County to continue working to keep our waterways clean.

HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

The 319 grant pays 60% of repair/replacement cost and the homeowner pays the remaining 40%. Additional funds may be available to qualifying homeowners.

WHAT ABOUT PRIVACY?

Participation in the program is voluntary. Survey information will not be shared with other agencies and owner will not be subject to penalties as a result of inquiry or participation.
